Endangering the Health and Safety of Self or Others

USMH will call 9-1-1 and involve the Hagerstown Police when individuals or groups endanger or tend to endanger the safety, health or life of any person.

**Procedure for Guns and other Deadly Weapons on
Campus**

In following the policies of our partner institutions, USMH prohibits the unauthorized carrying or possession of firearms, knives or deadly weapons on campus with the exception of sworn police officers.

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Fire/Safety/Health Procedural Information

Because the coordinating institution for USMH is Frostburg State University, the primary document for conveying fire, safety and health procedures is the publication, *Employee Safety Programs at Frostburg State University*. A copy of this publication shall be revised and re-issued to every employee on a two-year cycle. The most current version will be issued to every new employee within 30 days of initial employment.

Fire alarm procedures are included in the employee safety manual, but will be revised and administered to accommodate USMH facilities, and accommodate any requirements of WCPS in that BISFA students routinely use USMH facilities.

Procedures for those with potential occupational exposure to blood or other human bodily fluids are described in the Frostburg State University blood-borne pathogen plan.

Additional procedures may be developed and promulgated as needs or regulations dictate.

Current procedures are subject to revision as specified by regulation, or upon the recommendation of FSU or USMH Administration.
